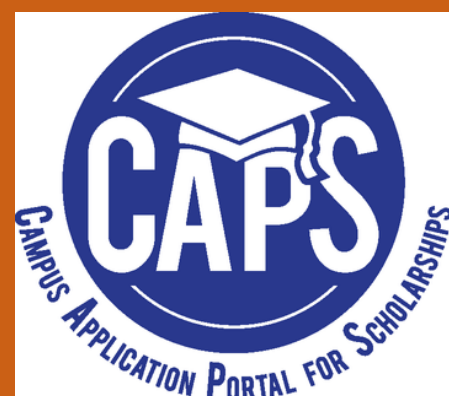
**Are you dedicated to serving the community?**

## **Eligibility Requirements:**

- Freshman or sophomore status in Fall 2021
- Enrolled full-time at Buffalo State
- Resident and graduate of a Western New York high school
- 85% high school / 2.5 college GPA
- Community service and/or leadership experience
- Has completed the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

Apply for a \$5000/year renewable scholarship.

# Frederick and Marilyn Howe Community Engagement Scholarship

## What expenses does the scholarship cover?

Scholarship will be used toward non-tuition costs billed by the college:

1. Qualified costs of attendance (mandatory fees, required books and supplies)
2. Any remaining funds will be used for non-qualified costs of attendance, including required health insurance, on-campus housing, and meal plans.

## Is the scholarship renewable each year?

Yes, for up to 3 additional years, provided the recipient:

- remains enrolled full-time
- maintains a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher
- completes 200 hours of community service annually in coordination with the Civic and Community Engagement Office, and demonstrate excellence in their community engagement and leadership activities.

## How do I apply?

- Complete the general scholarship application on CAPS
- Search for "Frederick and Marilyn Howe Community Engagement Scholarship" to submit an application
- Upload a letter of recommendation
- Complete a short answer response (maximum 200 words each):
  - *Describe your involvement in leadership activities and your leadership skills.*
  - *How has your community service experience impacted your personal growth, values, personal philosophies, attitudes, and world views?*
