COVID – RANDOM TESTING via PCR TESTS

Random testing is rescheduled for **March 28th at 9:30 AM**. Parents/guardians of randomly selected students were notified via email on Thursday, March 24th. Testing will take place in Discovery's CARES Room (Room 106).

NYS ASSESSMENTS (Grades 3-8)

Testing is scheduled this week [March 30-31 (ELA)]. Math will take place on April 27-28. We ask that you please consider allowing your child/children to take the NYS Assessments. Due to COVID, many students in Grades 4-5 have not experienced the assessment, MOST students in Grades 4-8 do not have CURRENT data on file, and ALL schools in NYS are expected to have a minimum of 95% participation. Schools that do not meet the 95% participation rate MUST show progress in every subgroup and subject for which the school was designated. **Participation matters!!** We do not want to lose out "Good Standing" status. Due to limited space, any student that refuses to take the assessments, will remain in the classroom while their peers test. Please note: Students cannot read, use a device, or complete work until all students finish the test.

REMOTE LEARNING

At-home learning is **only provided** to students that test positive for COVID, are in mandatory quarantine, were approved for a medical exemption, or if Dr. Williams closes school.

WIFI/ HOTSPOTS

Hotspots are available to all BPS families who do not have Internet access at home. Families are welcome to come to our open hours to pick up student computing devices, hotspots or to bring devices in for repair.

COVID – DIAGNOSTIC TESTING

The consent form below will be utilized by the school nurse for individuals that present symptoms during the day and receive a diagnostic test. Protocols for sick students will be followed and individuals will still be sent home. Here is the link for the form: [Consent form for Symptomatic testing](#)

THIS IS DIFFERENT FROM THE “RANDOM” TESTING PROCESS WE CURRENTLY HAVE IN PLACE. Submitting the permission slip will enable a symptomatic student to be tested at school. **Whether the results are negative or positive, a child will be sent home from school and required to follow protocols because diagnostic testing involves a rapid test. This is NOT test-to-stay.**

COVID - AT-HOME TEST – POSITIVE RESULT

If a child tests positive, regardless of vaccination status, he/she must isolate for 5-days. Please inform school of the test date and self-report the positive test result on the ECDOH website. Here is the link:

COVID - LABORATORY TEST – POSITIVE RESULT

*Inform school/daycare facility

*Provide a copy of the results to school (be sure to include the test date and test site)

COVID - AT-HOME TEST – NEGATIVE RESULT

If a child tests **negative**, but is symptomatic, the at-home test result does not suffice for a child to return to school. **A symptomatic child may only return to school if they:**

- Obtain a negative test result from a laboratory rapid antigen test (provide school a copy of the results)
- Obtain a negative test result from a laboratory PCR test (provide school a copy of the results)
- Get a medical clearance note with an alternate diagnosis (provide school a copy of the letter)
- Quarantine for 5-days (contact school – 816-4922)
