



### Leadership Bio

Early on in his career, Aubrey Lloyd started his educational career as a Physical Education Teacher in Brooklyn, Schenectady and Buffalo. Concurrently, Lloyd was a Head Track Coach and Assistant Coach for various sports. Here in Buffalo, Lloyd stepped in as an Assistant Principal at Harvey Austin Elementary School. From there, he quickly advanced as the Supervisor of Health, Physical Education and Athletics for five years. In 2009, to help children receive 60 minutes of daily physical activity, Lloyd developed and directed the Buffalo Athletics Summer Camps for over 1,000 girls and boys.

In 2010, Aubrey Lloyd was hired as the Director of Athletics and led Buffalo Public Schools football program into Section VI federated Football. International Preparatory High School Boys Soccer won the 2014 State Championship. South Park High School won its first State Championship in 2015. During 2011, Lloyd restructured the Boys and Girls Basketball Leagues to increase competition. As a result, McKinley High School Boys Basketball, Middle Early College Boys Basketball, and East High School Boys Basketball found success by winning State Championships under great leadership with skilled student-athletes.

Throughout the years, in response to creating competitive programs, Lloyd secured funds to create a five-phase plan to install 19 state-of-the-art weight and fitness facilities across the District. In addition, gymnasium upgrade projects were executed by purchasing scorers tables, padded chairs, and scoreboards for all High Schools. While working collaboratively with all stakeholders, Buffalo's athletic facilities were transformed.

Throughout Lloyd's tenure, he spent countless hours serving and collaborating on various committees including: Section VI Athletic Council, Finance committee, Combining of Schools Committee, Modified Committee, Ralph C. Wilson Committee, Wille Evans Committee to Restore Fosdick Field, Buffalo Public Schools Foundation Committee, and numerous other curriculum committees. As Athletic Director, Lloyd continuously found opportunities to increase participation numbers and exposure for Buffalo student-athletes, especially with girls sports. Over years, he added Section VI sports where all Buffalo Public Schools student-athletes could compete at the highest level.

Lloyd has always placed an emphasis on academics by partnering with local colleges to offer 21 NCAA Clearinghouse workshops and community schools programming. Through supporting teaching and learning, Lloyd facilitated professional development trainings with the United States Tennis Association (USTA), US Lacrosse, Canisius College Athletics, Buffalo Youth Lacrosse, FC Buffalo, In-School Bowling, Speed Cup Stacking and OmniKin.

Lloyd cultivated and maintained positive relationships with local professional sports teams such as the Buffalo Bills to create and implement fitness programs such as WNY Girls In Sports, Play 60 and NFL Flag Football.

Away from Buffalo Public Schools, Lloyd is a team manager/assistant coach for the City Honors/Cardinal O'Hara and Buffalo Bisons Hockey Programs.

Educationally, Lloyd graduated from Canisius College in 1998 with a Bachelor of Science in Physical Education. He received a Master of Science in Educational Administration and Policy Studies from the University at Albany in 2002.
