

CONDOM AVAILABILITY PROGRAM (CAP)



CAP was developed to assure students have the skill, knowledge and resources they need to reduce the risk of sexually transmitted diseases and unplanned pregnancies.

What is CAP?

School nurses are available during school hours for the following

- Accurate and complete personal health guidance information on topics such as: abstinence, HIV/STD prevention, and information on how to remain healthy.
- Information on how to correctly use a latex condom.
- Free condoms are available for students in 9th through 12th grades, as long as the student has not been opted-out by a parent.
- A list of places to get health care, pamphlets and other information on a variety of health related topics.

Did you know?

- The Erie County Department of Health reports that 1 in 6 of diagnosed cases of sexually transmitted infections (STIs) occur in teens ages 19 and younger.
- 33% of new HIV infections in Erie County occurred in young people aged 15-24. (NYS Dept. of Health)
- New York has the highest rate of HIV infection in the country.

Not having sex is the only 100% sure way to avoid being sexually exposed to HIV/STD's.
