Example: pen/cil

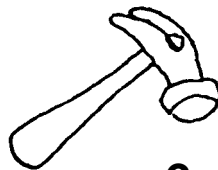
• **When a two-syllable word with the VCCV pattern ends with -s, -es, or -ed, the word is still divided after the first consonant.**

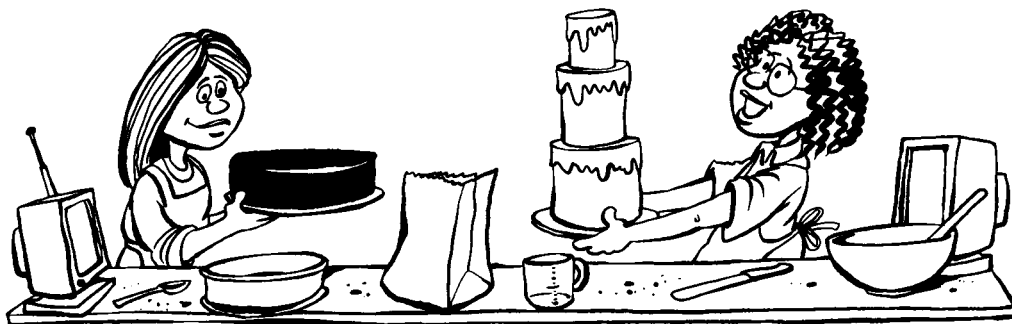
